

VESTRY HIGHLIGHTS DECEMBER 15, 2020

- ◆ Welcome Melanie Garman was welcomed back to CEC on November 23, 2020.
- ◆ **Sanctuary Audio Study** The study must be done when an actual service can be replicated. Since in-person services are not currently allowed the audit is on-hold.
- ◆ **Sewage and Storm Drains** A priority project. Bid received from Economy Plumbing. Bid price \$3800. Work to begin weather permitting.
- Stewardship Campaign Received to date 47 pledges totaling \$101,431; Two prepaid 2021 pledges one for \$1500 and a second for \$1200 and 15 non-pledgers. Pledges are continuing to be returned. Pledges to date are under the 2020 budget by \$42,676.
- ♦ Payment Protection Program (federal PPP) Funds received in June in the amount of \$25,000. The loan is forgiven if funds are used to continue to pay staff salary compensation. CEC can file a request for forgiveness of the loan if the funds were used for staff salary compensation. CEC has filed for Forgiveness in December. Board acknowledged all of Laurie Tonn's hard work and thanks her for her dedication and efforts.

Look for upcoming information on our 2021 Annual Meeting. Fr. Jeff is working with the Diocese to see how we can seamlessly stream our meeting. They have several resources available to the churches in the Diocese for conducting virtual meetings with voting ability.

Lincoln School —Warren Family Mission

Adopt a Family

In November CEC received a request from Lincoln School to participate in the Adopt a Family program. Upon agreeing we received information on nine families. Each child receives an outfit of clothing and a gift based on their noted area/s of interest along with a small gift for their parent/s. Those nine families represented 12 parents and 29 children ranging in age from 2 to 17 years old, At least 73 presents were bought. On Thursday, December 16th the gifts along with two boxes of food – one with general food items and the second with food for a Christmas dinner featuring a ham and all the trimmings were distributed. Your gifts to parents acknowledge the efforts of these individual's dedication to ensure that their children have food, shelter, clothing and a start on a good life. The children received Christmas presents, more than likely, the only ones they received.

In addition, The Christmas Giving Tree collected three garbage bags full of toys. They were distributed along with the pick-up school lunch program.

Often times words are insufficient in saying thank you and so instead "God Bless You." for your generosity.

The future of Lincoln School children remains unclear. They remain on Christmas vacation until January 4, 2021. I am unsure whether they will come back to on-line classes or a hybrid plan of some on-line classes and some in-person classes. The status of the Pantry is also unclear. As of the start of their Christmas vacation Lincoln had not yet received notification on whether their 2021 United Way grant which allows them to purchase food for the Pantry from Second Harvest was funded. At the December Vestry meeting the Vestry approved \$400 from Outreach funds to purchase food for the Pantry. The cupboard was bare at Christmas time.

Regardless of whether the Pantry is funded in 2021 emergency food supplies are always needed. The Blessing Box needs: Pasta, Spaghetti sauce, Peanut Butter, Jelly, Saltine crackers, Soup (tomato and chicken noodle),

Deliveries continue. CEC donated a trunk load of food from the Blessing Box. The Mission has been very busy serving 2,166 turkey dinners for Thanksgiving and 2,182 ham dinners for Christmas. In addition, food give away continues. At the December Vestry meeting the Vestry approved \$200 from Outreach funds to purchase food for the Mission.



Trumbull County Combined Health District

Tier 1A COVID Vaccine Registration

At this time, the Trumbull County Combined Health District (TCCHD) and the Warren City Health District (WCHD) are working together to plan the administration of vaccine to Tier 1A-eligible persons. Vaccine is in very limited supply and is expected to stay in limited supply for the near future. As such, TCCHD and WCHD will be scheduling limited small vaccine clinics based on the number of vaccines we have on hand at the time of the clinic. *Clinics will be by invitation only*.

Please complete the registration survey at https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/JPYT76. Your answers will allow us to plan for future vaccine clinics. Based on your answers, our health department staff will contact you with the date and time of the clinic that you should attend. If for any reason your answers exclude you from Tier 1A, we will hold your information for a later tier. Please understand that even if you are Tier 1A-eligible, it may be several weeks until your clinic is scheduled. All scheduling will be based on vaccine availability.

WITH THE ONGOING COVID-19 PANDEMIC, TRUMBULL MOBILE MEALS WANTS TO MAKE SURE THAT WE ARE DOING EVERYTHING POSSIBLE TO PROTECT THE HEALTH AND SAFETY OF OUR MEAL SUBSCRIBERS, VOLUNTEERS AND STAFF AND AT THE SAME TIME ENSURE NO MEAL SUBSCRIBER IS WITHOUT ACCESS TO A DAILY MEAL.

TRUMBULL MOBILE MEALS IS NOW BACK TO DELIVERING MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY ONCE AGAIN. WE HAVE ADOPTED A ZERO CONTACT DELIVERY SYSTEM TO HELP KEEP SUBSCRIBER AND DRIVER SAFE. A SUBSCRIBER MUST PLACE A COOLER IN FRONT OF THEIR DOOR. OUR DRIVER WILL THEN PUT THE MEAL INTO THE COOLER AND RING THE BELL OR KNOCK TO LET THE RECIPEANT KNOW THEIR MEAL HAS BEEN DELIVERED.

TMM was started in 1970 by Jean Schlecht and Pat Venetta, with the help of fellow members of the Trumbull Medical Society Alliance. Started with just one client, and then increased to two when his neighbor told Jean Schlecht that since we had fed his neighbor for two weeks and had not poisoned him he would take our meals too.

TMM serves approximately 230 clients Monday through Friday. Provided is a hot meal and one cold sack lunch, made fresh in our kitchen every day. They offers regular diets and modified meals for those who have special dietary needs.

Today, TMM serves 460 meals Monday through Friday and provides weekend meals for those who need additional help.

Each day, 40-45 volunteers prepare, pack and deliver the meals Monday through Friday.
